

How to accurately locate the grounding point of cable trays



Overview

A cable tray grounding is best inspected by searching cable tray sections with bonding jumpers (the thick green or copper wires connecting various sections of the tray) and checking them with a device known as a multimeter. Cable tray may be used as the Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC) in any installation where qualified persons will service the installed cable tray system. When the connection is very close, and the meter indicates a low resistance. Cable tray grounding wire is the safety connection that links your electrical system's cable tray to the ground. This article provides a comprehensive framework that governs various aspects of cable tray installations, including. Power circuit grounding of cable trays is explained in CTI Technical Bulletins, Titles No. 8, 11, and 12, and the National Electrical Code Sections 318-3-© and 318-7.
